

Wyoming

"Although the state of Wyoming does not currently have statewide requirements to become a massage therapist, many cities and counties in the state may have their own licensing rules. Therapists wanting to practice in the state will need to consult their locality for information. In addition, the State of Wyoming legislature is working to formulate a regulatory board for massage therapy. This will eventually lead to statewide licensing and licensing requirements. The implementation date for this board is not known at this time. Professional massage therapy associations believe the state will adopt a 500 hour course of massage therapy education to be the minimum requirement, and will also expect licensees to pass a national certification exam. The examinations most often used by states are the NCBTMB and the MBLEx."
